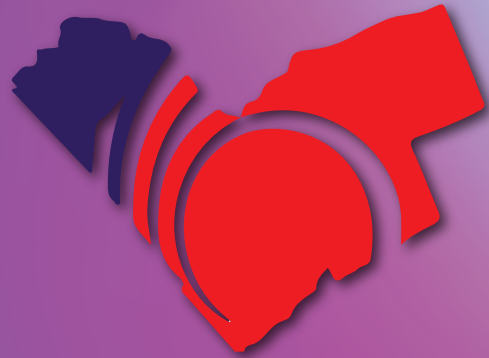

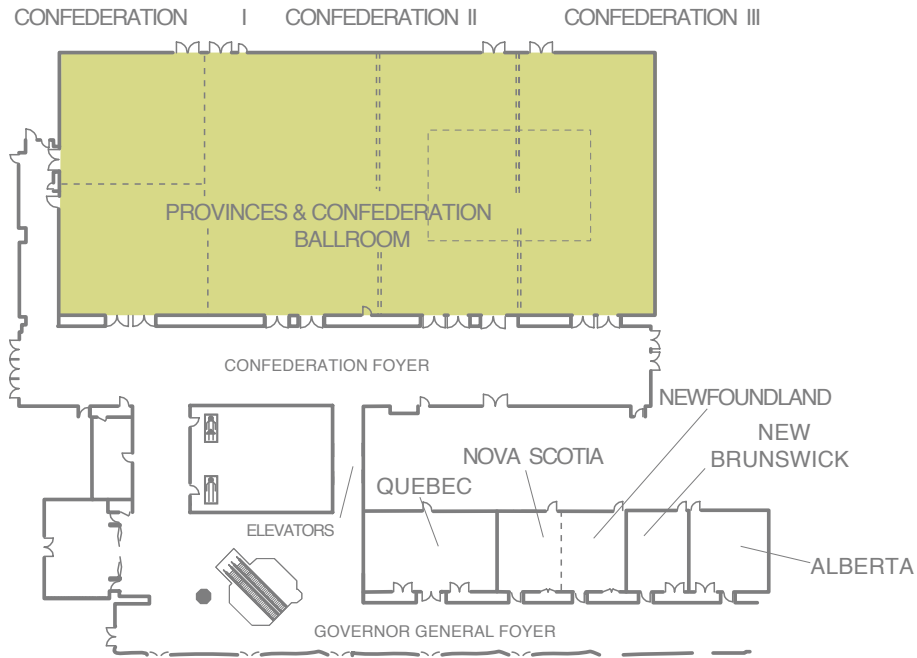

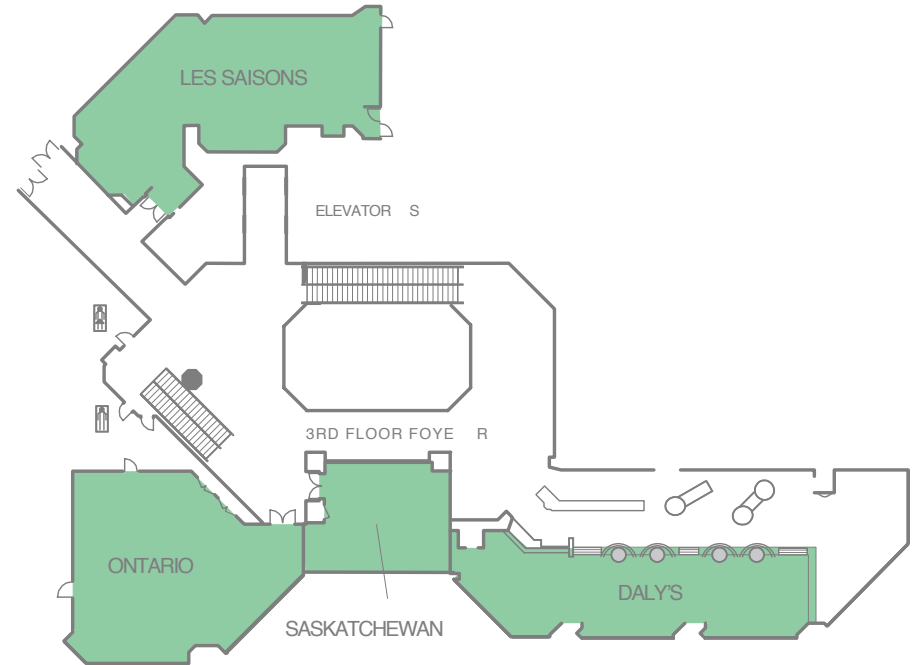
The Westin Ottawa Hotel: Floor Plans

4th Floor

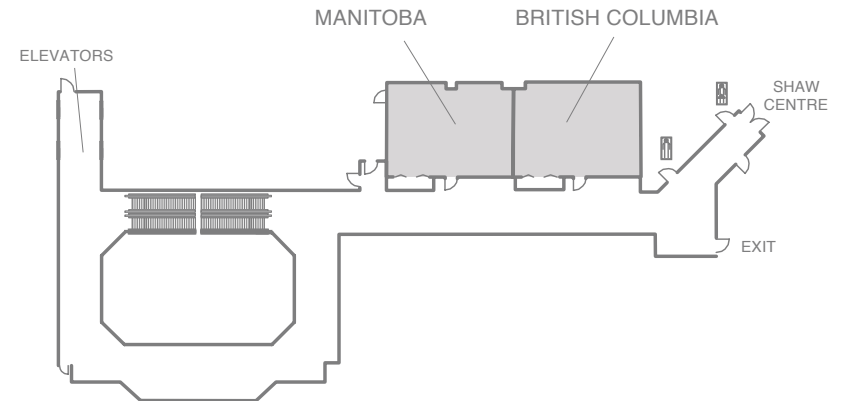
